













EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED IN AUGUST





GRANDPARENTS DAY - (12/09/21)


On 12th September grandparents day was observed. Students shared their images with their grandparents while seeking their blessings.



Hindi Diwas (14/09/2021)



DUSSEHRA – (15/10/21)



Devotees also keep fast during the Navratri festival, which they devote to the nine incarnations of Goddess Durga . GALLANTRY AWARD WINNERS (11/11/2021)

Gallantry Awards have been instituted by the Government of India to honour the acts of bravery and sacrifice of the officers/personnel of the Armed Forces, other lawfully constituted Forces and civilians. These gallantry awards are announced twice in a year - first on the occasion of the Republic Day and then on the occasion of the Independence Day. Post-independence, first three gallantry awards namely the Param Vir Chakra, the Maha Vir Chakra and the Vir Chakra were instituted by the Government of India on 26th January 1950 which were deemed to have effect from the 15th August, 1947.

Thereafter, other three gallantry awards i.e. the Ashoka Chakra Class-I, the Ashoka Chakra Class-II and the Ashoka Chakra Class-III were instituted by the Government of India on 4th January, 1952, which were deemed to have effect from the 15th August, 1947. These awards were renamed as the Ashoka Chakra, the Kirti Chakra and the Shaurya Chakra respectively in January, 1967. Students of YPS selected one brave soldier of their district, town, city, state and country and made posters wrote about their acts of bravery for which they received gallantry award. This activity was given by CBSE.

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




Children's Day (14/11/2021)

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




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National Mathematics Day – (22/12/21)

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

Speech

Today I am going to talk about Shri Swami Vivekananda's iconic speech at the world religion conference which is remembered till now.

The speech that blew every one's mind , Swami Vivekananda had mentioned the basic yet most important thing that one should follow in life. These things included being patriotic, loving all religions, analyzing religions, being acquainted with science , Knowing importance and necessity of rituals, being aware of roots of Hinduism, being aware of goal of science and being against religious conversation. Though initially nervous, he bowed to Saraswati, the Hindu goddess of learning, and he felt he got new energy in his body; he felt someone or something else had occupied his body– "The Soul of India, the echo of the Rishis, and the voice of Ramakrishna. Then began his speech with salutation, "Sisters and brothers of America!". To these words, he got a standing ovation from a crowd of seven thousand, which lasted for two minutes. When the silence was restored he began his address. He greeted the youngest of the nations on behalf of "the most ancient order of monks in the world, the Vedic order of *sannyasis*, a religion which has taught the world both tolerance and universal acceptance."

In his speech, Vivekananda tried to explain the reason of disagreement between each other and different sects and religions. He told a story of a frog, which is popularly known as (*koopmandook*) and in the story he told, a frog used to live in a well. It was born there and brought up there, and it used to think his well was the biggest water land of the world. One day, a frog from a sea came to that well. When the frog from the sea told the frog of the well that the sea is much bigger than that well, the frog of the well did not believe it and drove the frog of the sea away from his well. Vivekananda concluded– "That has been the difficulty all the while. I am a Hindu. I am sitting in my own little well and thinking that the whole world is my little well. The Christian sits in his little well and thinks the whole world is his well. The Muslim sits in his little well and thinks that it is his whole world."

Vivekananda gave a short introduction of Hinduism and spoke on "The meaning of the Hindu religion". He also talked about the 3 oldest religions of the world, namely Hinduism, Zoroastrianism and Judaism and their survival and the emergence of Christianity. He then went ahead and shared his knowledge of the Vedanta philosophy, the concept of god, soul and body in Hinduism. In his speech, Vivekananda talked on Buddhism. He talked about origin of Buddhism, relation between Buddhism and Brahmanism, Buddhism and Vedas. He concluded, "Hinduism cannot live without Buddhism, nor Buddhism without Hinduism." and showed how Buddhism is the fulfilment to Hinduism.

In his address at the final session on September 27, 1893 he told that much has been said about common ground of religious unity but according to him unity cannot come by Triumph of anyone of the religion and destruction of others but each must assimilate the spirit of other religion and yet preserve his individuality and grow according to his own law of growth in the same way as the seed is put in the ground and earth and air and water are placed around it. Does the seed become the earth ??? Or the air ?? Or the water ? No it becomes a plant.. it develops after the law of its own growth , assimilates the air the earth and the water converts them into plant substance and grow into a plant.

He finished his speech with appeal "Help and not Fight," "Assimilation and not Destruction," "Harmony and Peace and not Dissension.".

Swami Vivekananda is an inspiration for the youth of today and present idol for us and that is why his birth anniversary is celebrated as National youth day.

The salient features of the new National Education Policy 2020 are:


- Increased focus on regional languages


